Inland Fishing Regulations:

Trout

The following areas are **Special Management Areas:** Indian Bay, Middle Brook and Northwest Brook Watershed, Indian Bay (including tributary streams and connecting ponds).

Season Dates:

Summer Season

May 15 – Aug 8, 2012

Labour Day

Sept. 2 – 5, 2012

Winter Season

Feb. 1 – Apr. 1, 2013

~ Possession limit for trout in special Management Areas is the daily bag limit of **6 trout or 2lbs (0.9kg) + 1 trout.**

~Residents of the province do not require an inland fishery licence to angle for trout. Non-residents are required to obtain an inland fishery licence to take trout.

~ No person angling in inland waters may use more than one rod and line at any time.

Exception is winter trout angling where an angler can use a maximum of 3 lines through the ice. Lines must be closely and constantly attended to by the angler.

Salmon

Season Dates: June 1 – Sept. 7, 2012

~Angling of salmon is not permitted without a valid salmon inland fishery licence.

~Angling on scheduled salmon rivers is permitted only between one hour before sunset and

one hour after sunset.

~Seasonal retention limits for Class II Rivers is 4 fish; Class III Rivers is 2 fish. Daily retention limits are 2 fish per day with a possession limit of twice the daily bag limit.

~Anglers can also catch & release salmon where permitted with a valid licence. Daily catch & release limits are 4 fish per day.

~Anglers are not permitted to catch and retain any salmon fry, parr, smolt, or salmon less than 30 cm or any salmon measuring more than 63 cm in length.

Did you know:

- Operating ATV's near waterways and sensitive areas like bogs and marshes can impact fish habitat and watershed ecosystems.
- Avoid crossing water bodies on ATV. Shallow, gravel areas are often preferred spawning sites for fish.
- Avoid stream, rivers, lakes, marshes, beaches and wetlands, even if they are dry at the time of crossings. Repeated crossings can damage plants and leave soil exposed.

Follow safe practices when operating ATV's and boats!
